This course aims to develop basic communication skills (mainly speaking and listening skills) through a wide variety of activities based on practical situations which a student of Japanese could expect to encounter. The students will learn hiragana, katakana, 40 kanji characters, approximately 300 vocabulary words (basic nouns, verbs, adjectives, and expressions), pronunciation and basic grammar in "long forms" (formal/polite forms).
