[Course Outline / Description]

This course is for those who are enrolled in Japanese Level 1. No prior knowledge of written Japanese is presupposed. This course will introduce the writing system of Japanese language, such as Hiragana, Katakana, and Kanji, and aims at developing reading and writing skills in Japanese through simple everyday topics such as diaries, messages, and letters. 58 kanji characters will be introduced. This course will cover Lesson 1 through Lesson 6 of the Reading and Writing section of Genki I 3rd edition.

- 1) Learn how to write as well as read in Japanese.
- 2) Learn to be able to write 58 *kanji* characters, after learning the two sets of phonetic characters, namely *hiragana* and *katakana* characters.
- 3) Learn some more vocabulary that is not covered in the spoken part of the textbook, including *kanji* vocabulary.
- 4) Learn to be able to write about your daily life, schedule, trips, favorite places, etc., and also learn how to write a letter, how to type in Japanese.
- 5) Learn how to type in Japanese on your computer and smartphones etc.

[Course Outline / Description]

This course is designed as the most introductory and/or elementary level of reading and writing Japanese. The course presupposes no prior knowledge of written Japanese. Starting with the introduction of two sets of syllabic characters, i.e., *hiragana* and *katakana*, approximately 60 *kanji* characters will also be introduced during the semester. The course will be devoted not only to the learning of *hiragana*, *katakana*, and *kanji*, but also to training in the writing of compositions and to the development of reading comprehension ability. In this course, you will read and write Japanese on simple everyday topics such as journals, messages, postcards, etc. Two lesson tests as well as midterm and final exams will be given during the semester. Homework assignments will also be given regularly.

Section 2

[Course Objectives/Goals/Learning Outcomes]

The overall objective of this course is to acquire very basic literacy skills in Japanese. Taking this course, students will specifically be able:

1) to read and write *hiragana*, *katakana*, and approximately 60 basic *kanji*; and

2) to read and write in Japanese about simple everyday topics such as journals, messages, postcards, etc.
