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[Course Outline / Description]

This course is to tackle with translation of English into Japanese and vice versa. Students are *expected* to have N2 level Japanese proficiency. We will, also, work on Japanese grammar with considerable time and attention.

What we are expected to attain is to know the both languages better in terms of syntax/semantic and pragmatics. To know the difference allows us to rebuild the source language more naturally into the target language.

A more specific goal is that you find yourself one level higher in your JLPT level, ie, if N3, N2, or N2, N1, and such.

Things to concern:

No makeup tests are given (unless something beyond your control has occurred to you).

It is critical that students attend the class regularly. Your final grade dropped 0.5% for each absence. For example, if you miss 2 classes in total during the semester, 1% will be deducted from your final grade. Serious illness is considered as excused absence, only when written proof is submitted. class by the time the start the bell rings. A student who is more than 25 minutes late for a class is considered absent from the class rather than tardy.

What we do is to work on lessons on Japanese grammar, one chapter a week, and short newspaper articles, one article a lesson. One of you presents your own translation of the article each time to lead comprehension of the article of the class.
