JAPANESE 3

[Course Description]

Prerequisite: Japanese 2 (or its equivalent)

This course is the third level in elementary Japanese. New students must pass a placement test in order to enroll. Students will continue to develop their Japanese from the foundational skills established in the pre-requisite elementary level courses. This course focuses on extensive speaking and listening practice, introducing vocabulary, grammar and expressions. The course also introduces writing skills for communication. Approximately 300 words and 90 kanji will be introduced. This course will cover Lesson 13 through Lesson 18 of Genki II Third edition, which is equivalent to JLPT* N4 and N5 or CEFR** A2.1 level proficiency (speaking).

By the end of the course, students should be able to function in everyday situations, such as saying what one can or cannot do, explaining about people or things in detail, apologizing, talking about hopes and wishes, conveying hearsay, etc.
