

## JAPANESE 4

## 【Course Description】

Prerequisite: Japanese 3 (or its equivalent)

This course is the fourth level in elementary Japanese. New students must pass a placement test in order to enroll. Students will continue to develop their Japanese from the foundational skills established in the pre-requisite elementary level courses. A variety of classroom activities are designed to improve all four skills: listening, speaking, writing and reading. Approximately 320 words and 150 kanji will be introduced. This course will cover Lesson 18 through Lesson 23 of Genki II Third edition, which is equivalent to JLPT\* N4 or CEFR\*\* A2.2 level proficiency (speaking).

## 【Course Objectives】

By the end of the course, students should be able to achieve the following objectives:

1. Students will be able to gain knowledge of basic grammar and idiomatic expressions commonly encountered in daily Japanese life, such as honorific and humble expressions.
2. Students will be able to demonstrate basic writing skills and ability to express ideas in coherent paragraphs.
3. Students will be able to read and write email texts, letters, short essays, etc.

**Class Performance:** You will practice in class, as either individual practices or group practices. Active and informed participation is expected. Your preparation and review of the material for each class are essential because your preparation/review will directly affect your performance in the classroom.
