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# Fiction in Action Six Japanese Novels and their Film Adaptations

[Course Outline / Description]

After a general introduction, the course will develop on six distinctive segments, each of them giving the students the opportunity to explore and analyze fully the characteristics of six different narratives — ranging from ghost stories to caricature, from social commentary to love stories and drama — as listed below:

Each class is designed to study in depth the key elements of the novels / short stories and their corresponding film adaptations.

The plots and narrative elements of the different stories will be analyzed, balancing textual and visual analysis, with discussions on how the stories are structured (looking at the characters' features, the relationships they form, the themes developed etc.).

The classes will also provide the students with information on how fiction connects with issues in Japanese society and culture (the disruptions of war, ambitions, bullying at school, love and marriage, the applications of morals, the construction of modern identity etc.).

Section 2

[Course Objectives/Goals/Learning Outcomes]

This course is meant to develop the students' ability to interpret and contextualize prominent

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modern and contemporary Japanese works which, beside national popularity, gained international recognition as well.

The students will thus acquire notions of critical thinking, discipline and learn methods to compare, describe and analyze precisely and in detail what constitutes a good story / movie. They will also gain perspectives on how directors adapt / change the author's text to form their own movie versions.

#### Instruction to students

Students are required to come to class prepared and ready to discuss the movies and the texts (novels, short stories).

During Zoom sessions (synchronous classes), having the camera on, at least when speaking, will be required. Make sure your internet connexion is stable and allowing such use.

As for asynchronous classes, the students will have to consult the course website for material and instructions as well as comment activities.

Concerning the midterm and final exams, the students will be required to write two different 1500 words essays, in which they will have to focus on in depth analysis, research and make sure they edit their essay using *The Chicago Manual of Style*. Concerning class participation, the grade will be based on the student's implication during Zoom discussions as well as in answering the questions prompted on the course website.
