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Course Description

In this interactive class, students will explore current popular approaches to presentation and examine techniques from some of the world's top professionals. The Presentation Zen approach challenges the conventional wisdom of making multimedia presentations in today's world and encourages students to think differently and more creatively about the preparation, design, and delivery of presentations. Based on research from the cognitive sciences, combined with principles from the world of the Zen arts, graphic design and visual communications, students will explore popular myths about what is an effective presentation and examine effective alternatives and approaches for designing and delivering better presentations. All throughout the class, the common themes are (1) restraint and clarity in preparation, (2) simplicity in design, and (3) naturalness in delivery. Story & storytelling is also a theme that is stressed throughout the class.

Course Objectives

In this course you will have the opportunity to improve all aspects of your online presentation skills: the verbal (what you say), the vocal (how you use your voice, volume, silence, etc.) and the visual (how you support your talk with slides and other visual aids, and how you use other forms of non-verbal communication such as eye-contact and body language). Students also have the opportunity to make a short video presentation and to learn the basics of professional video creation including planning, shooting, and editing.

By examining visual communication concepts, you will be able to think more critically about design and organize your visuals accordingly. At the end of this course, you will be a better visual storyteller and better able to express your ideas through professional videos and online presentations.

Instruction to Students

Attendance for the class is very important. As you will give online presentations in the class and also create presentation videos and short documentary-style videos, you will need to spend several hours outside of class preparing your material.
