[Course Outline / Description]

This course is for those who are enrolled in Japanese Level 1 and with little or no know knowledge of the language, and will cover Lesson 1 through Lesson 6 of the Reading and Writing section of *Genki* I [3rd edition]. Students will master reading and writing of *Hiragana* and *Katakana* (two of the Japanese wiring systems that represent sounds) and 58 *Kanji* (Chinese characters) by the end of this course through simple materials such as diaries, messages, and letters.

 \bigstar Though the class name is "Kanji and Readings 1", the first one-third of the semester will be dedicated to *Hiragana* and *Katakana*, the two of the basic Japanese alphabets, and we will not learn any *Kanji* until you master those two. \bigstar

[Course Outline / Description]

Kanji and Readings 1 aims at developing reading and writing skills in Japanese on simple everyday topics such as diaries, messages, and letters. The *kanji* in Japanese 1 (JPN1) will be reviewed, and approximately 30 more *kanji* will be introduced.
