JAPANESE 1

[Course Description]

This is an elementary level course in Japanese for beginners who have no formal training in the language. This course aims to provide a basic foundation that will enable students to acquire and develop language skills in listening, speaking, reading, and writing in Japanese. Approximately 300 vocabulary words and 40 kanji will be introduced. This course will cover Lesson 1 through Lesson 6 of Genki I Third edition, which is equivalent to CEFR** A1.1 level proficiency (speaking).

[Course Objectives]

By the end of the course, students should be able to achieve the following objectives:

- 1. Students will be able to read and write Japanese letters (Hiragana, Katakana, and 40 Kanji).
- 2. Students will be able to speak in Japanese using vocabulary (approx. 300 basic nouns, verbs, adjectives, and expressions).
- 3. Students will be able to function in everyday situations such as making requests, stating reasons, describing things, etc. in Japanese.
