【Course Outline / Description】

This course is for those who are enrolled in Japanese 1, and covers Lesson 1 through Lesson 6 of the Reading and Writing Section of *Genki I* **third** edition. This means that students will review *kanji* introduced in Japanese 1 and be able to add more to their repertoire. No prior knowledge of written Japanese is presupposed.

【Course Objectives/Goals/Learning Outcomes】

Successful learners are expected to become able to

- gain basic knowledge of Japanese Writing System.
- write 58 *kanji* characters, after learning the two sets of phonetic characters, namely *katakana* and *hiragana* characters.
- learn some more vocabulary that is not covered in the spoken part of the textbook, including *kanji* vocabulary.
- read and write simple texts about known topics, such as daily routines, trips and favorite places.
- type in Japanese.

Ask for the instructor's permission should you need to use your smartphone during class. Overreliance on dictionaries and machine translation, at this novice-level Japanese-language course may hinder your ability to apply newly introduced characters, vocabulary and sentence structures in real-life situations. Additionally, what you write may appear awkward due to the significantly different grammatical structures and registers between languages.

【Course Outline / Description】

This course is designed as the most introductory and/or elementary level of reading and writing Japanese. The course presupposes no prior knowledge of written Japanese. Starting with the introduction of two sets of syllabic characters, i.e., *hiragana* and *katakana*, approximately 60 *kanji* characters will also be introduced during the semester. The course will be devoted not only to the learning of *hiragana*, *katakana*, and *kanji*, but also to training in the writing of compositions and to the development of reading comprehension ability. In this course, you will read and write Japanese on simple everyday topics such as journals, messages, postcards, etc. Two lesson tests as well as midterm and final exams will be given during the semester. Homework assignments will also be given regularly.

Section 2

【Course Objectives/Goals/Learning Outcomes】

The overall objective of this course is to acquire very basic literacy skills in Japanese. Taking this course, students will specifically be able:

- 1) to read and write *hiragana*, *katakana*, and approximately 60 basic *kanji*; and
- 2) to read and write in Japanese about simple everyday topics such as journals, messages, postcards, etc.
